

# Mythbusters to amaze with science at GPRC this weekend

The popular Discovery Channel show brings its act to Grande Prairie this weekend as part of the Science Alberta Foundation's Science Happens Here campaign.

Hosts Tory Belleci, Kari Byron and Grant Imahara will take centre stage on Saturday at 7:30 p.m., at the Douglas J. Cardinal Performing Arts Centre at Grande Prairie Regional College. Tickets for the event sold out quickly, said Shari Burton, production foreman for the Suncor Energy Foundation.

Sponsored by Suncor, the weekend will also feature a science open house at GPRC, in the J-Wing from 3-7 p.m. on Saturday, featuring demonstrations and mini-lectures.

"It's all about the diversity of science," Burton said. "You don't have to be in a lab, wearing a coat and pair of goggles over a beaker. Science is everywhere."

Science Happens Here is a media outreach campaign that showcases examples of science at work in the community. It also features presentations on new careers, upgrading careers, and career possibilities for high school and post-secondary students.
