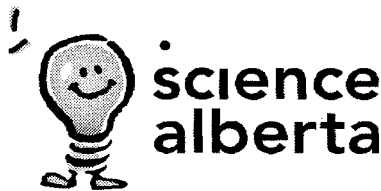


MythBuster show coming Sunday
